PROCEDURE FOR THE REGISTRATION OF PLEASURE YACHTS OF 500 GT AND OVER

Administrative requirements:

1. Application for Registration
2. Declaration of Non-Commercial use
3. Minimum Safe Manning Application
4. Copy of legalised and/or apostilled Bill of Sale or Builder's Certificate
5. Good Standing Certificate and recent Certificate of Incumbency
6. Permission for Transfer or recent Transcript of Register and/or recent Non-Encumbrance Certificate
7. Copy of International Tonnage Certificate, 1969
8. Accounting Authority Identification Code (A.A.I.C.) / P.S.A. and confirmation from the Authority that they are settling the Radio Traffic Accounts
9. Certificate of Entry from the vessel's P & I (Third Party Liability & Crew)
10. Payment of the relevant fees

Technical Requirements:

Class and Statutory:

- a. Classification Society to confirm that the vessel is in class and will be retained without recommendation
- b. Report of Inspection for pleasure yacht (issued by an authorized surveyor or Recognized Organization)
- c. MARPOL compliance
I.O.P.P. Certificate, I.A.P.P. Certificate including E.I.A.P.P. Certificate (required for any engine installed after 1st January 2000 with output power of more than 130 kW) , I.E.E. Certificate and I.S.P.P. Certificate
- d. International Convention on the Control of Harmful Antifouling Systems on Ships
Compliance: a Statement of Compliance with the International Convention on the Control of Harmful Antifouling Systems on Ships

FOR MASTERS AND OFFICERS: APPLICATION FOR THE ISSUE OF THE STCW 78, (AS AMENDED), ENDORSEMENT OR THE DOCUMENT OF RECOGNITION IF THEY ARE NOT IN POSSESSION OF THESE DOCUMENTS.

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
